Who We Are

Located 25 miles northwest of downtown Chicago, Rochelle Zell Jewish High School is a private, co-educational high school. Who We're Seeking

Duties and Responsibilities

As a member of the Student Services Team, you report directly to the Academic Dean. The following are your duties and responsibilities:

- Meet regularly with students on their caseload, primarily in 11th and 12th grade, to provide academic intervention (e.g. executive functioning coaching) and check-in support
- Work closely with partnered learning specialist(s) to read and evaluate incoming IEP/504 and psychoeducational reports both before and during admissions process
- Consult with the Director of Admissions and Recruitment to evaluate prospective student applications

- Write, edit, and update as needed incoming and/or pre-existing service plans
- Collaborate with faculty members to identify, develop, and support interventions to address student needs
- Guide students and parents through the standardized testing accommodations process for both the ACT and College Board (PSAT, SAT, & Advanced Placement) testing.
- Proctor standardized tests throughout the year, both during school hours and on select Sundays
- Partner with Testing Coordinator to ensure that students with accommodations are supported during standardized testing dates
